GINA 2020 Guidelines NEW! (Preferred Rescue Inhaler for Asthmatic Patients ≥12 years)


NO LONGER PREFERRED: SABA

For safety, GINA no longer recommends SABA-only treatment (e.g. albuterol or levalbuterol) for Step 1 or as the preferred reliever medication.¹

PREFERRED: ICS-FORMOTEROL

Direct evidence from two large studies, one showing a 64% reduction in severe exacerbations vs SABA-only treatment, support the use of budesonide-formoterol for rescue.²

HPSM COVERAGE: Budesonide-formoterol is on the Medi-Cal and Healthworx formularies. Brand Symbicort inhaler is on the CareAdvantage formulary.
